

BRITISH CIVIL WARS

In 1642 the country has descended into Civil War! What was it really like to live through this conflict? Become historians and investigate the challenges faced by soldiers and civilians.

This trail takes you to three different galleries in the Museum and you can visit them in any order.



IN **ARMY** GALLERY How did people choose sides? When the civil wars broke out, people all over the country had to choose which side they would support. There were many factors that influenced their choice. Look straight ahead to find the document signed by Charles I. It dates from August 1642 and asks Lord Willoughby to raise his army regiment. Why is this piece of paper important? Now investigate the painting of Oliver Cromwell, leader of the New Model Army and future Lord Protector. What is he wearing? What message is this painting trying to send?

In a civil war, it is harder to tell between friend and foe.

Can you find something nearby that would help you identify what side a soldier was fighting on?
(HINT: it's big and brightly coloured!)

IN **BATTLE** GALLERY

What challenges did soldiers face?

Soldiers in the British Civil Wars faced many difficulties and dangers. Attacks from the enemy, unreliable weapons, hunger, and disease all posed threats. However, soldiers did have some protection.

Look at the glass case to left just outside the gallery to find the Cavalryman figure. Cavalry soldiers charged the enemy on horseback. What dangers would they face?
Have a closer look at the weapons nearby. Why does he need to a sword if he already has a pistol? Do you think this pistol was reliable?
Now walk straight ahead, bearing right to find the bandolier. What is it for?
Do you think it would be easy to use in the heat of battle?



Find the Pikeman figure in the glass case to the right. What does he have to protect himself?


