


Buried among Kings:





A Warrior Buried in Westminster: What's the Story?

11 November 1920

The extraordinary tale of the unknown warrior buried today in Westminster Abbey

The Great War resulted in the deaths of hundreds of thousands of British soldiers, many of whom were never _____, leaving families and the nation stricken by grief. The idea for the Unknown Warrior was brought to life by _____ (an army Chaplain) and _____ (the Dean of Westminster Abbey). They persuaded King George V and prime minister David Lloyd George to bury one of the unidentified servicemen who had died on the Western Front to _____ all those who had died in action, especially the _____. The selection process took place in secret.

The following day, the coffin left France bound for _____ aboard the HMS Verdun. This morning, the Unknown Warrior was carried in a funeral procession through the city streets, lined by thousands of soldiers and crowds of _____, and brought to Westminster Abbey for _____. The inscription on his grave read: 'They buried him among the kings because he had done good toward God and toward his house!'
